

Lake Natoma YRE Bike (Y0036)  
Rancho Cordova, Calif.  
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1. Starting at Starbucks Coffee, turn right onto Tributary Point Dr.
2. At the bridge over the canal, turn right (Tributary Crossing Dr) over the bridge.
3. Go to the light and turn right onto Gold Country Blvd for 2 blocks.
4. Turn left into street with wooden sign “Region II Headquarters” in yellow letters.
5. Follow this road until it has a Y to the right onto the American River bike trail
6. Turn right onto the trail.
7. The trail will come out into the Salmon Hatchery, stay on the bike trail to the right that parallels the hatchery parking lot and goes under Hazel Blvd (see map below).
8. Stay on the bike trail as it goes across several roadways – watch for cars. You will see a park (Aquatic Park) entry building – turn left on the bike trail – take the road to the right, which passes the “sign shop” on your left. Follow the road until it states “do not enter” then take the bike trail to the right.
9. At the eastern end of Lake Natoma, after going under the bridge, go right up into the parking lot, then right over the bridge (see map below).
10. At the end of the bridge (Greenback Lane) go right for about 50 feet and take the right hand turn down the bike path. Several switchback turns here.
11. Where this path comes to a T, turn left.
12. Facing the parking lot, turn right on the trail going past the restrooms on the left.
13. Follow the bike trail back to Hazel Ave.
14. Go under Hazel Ave and come up on the far side. Turn right going down the bike trail paralleling Hazel Ave, turn left.
15. At the bottom of the hill the trail will merge back to the trail you came in on at the Salmon Hatchery (see map below).
16. Follow the bike trail across the roads entering the hatchery.
17. Follow the bike trail to where you entered it. Turn left on the road and follow it back to Gold Country Blvd. Turn right.
18. Turn left at the light onto Tributary Crossing Dr.
19. Turn left at Tributary Point Dr back to Starbucks, on the left.
